

JOB CORPS AT A GLANCE

Job Corps is a **tuition-free** training and education program that connects eligible young people with the skills and education opportunities they need to establish real careers.



WHAT IS JOB CORPS?

- | A U.S. Department of Labor program
- | 123 centers across the country
- | Free training and education

WHO QUALIFIES FOR JOB CORPS?

- | Eligible young people
- | Ages 16 through 24
- | Legal residents, lawfully admitted immigrants, or refugees

ON-CENTER BENEFITS

- | A stipend every 2 weeks
- | Access to basic medical care
- | Three meals a day
- | Feeling of safety—Job Corps has a Zero Tolerance Policy for drugs and violence

Training for the Real World

Job Corps is the first step for hardworking, committed young people to pursue their long-term career goals. The program offers:

- | Hands-on training from experienced instructors in more than 100 career training areas from Carpentry to Culinary Arts
- | High school diploma or the equivalent
- | Higher education—many Job Corps centers have partnerships with local community colleges, allowing students to take classes while living at Job Corps
- | Employability and interview skills

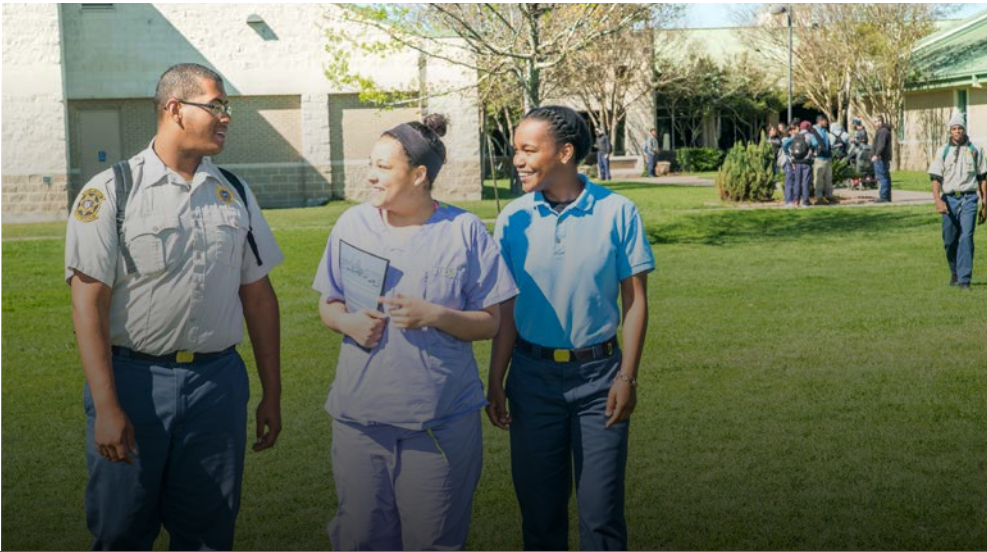
Job Corps offers training in many industries: health care, construction, security, information technology, and transportation, to name a few.

Students typically go to the Job Corps center nearest their hometown—but not always. Admissions Representatives can share photos of nearby centers or center-specific videos to give a sense of life on a Job Corps center.

After students complete the program, Job Corps staff members will connect them to resources that help them get started in the working world.

- | Child care services
